1. Introduction:

The Municipal Development and Lending Fund "MDLF" received a grant from the SDC towards the cost of "Area C Development Programme in the West Bank - Phase 2". Below is the summary sheet for the action:

2. Background on the Assignment

This Communities Mobilization Activities proposed under this phase contributes to the achievement of the outcome **"Strengthened social accountability of targeted LGUs towards citizens and civic groups (youth, women)**" which is endorsed in the Area "C" Development Programme-Phase 2.

The fulfilment of this outcome will result in a **"A pool of local CSOs, LGUs' staff, civil groups and citizens trained on Civic Participation and Social Accountability Guidelines"**. And, **"Enhanced public participation in influencing projects prioritization"**. These two outputs are endorsed in the project Logical Framework.

The community mobilization activities proposed are based on MDLF previous experience and lessons learned gained from the implementation of the completed five packages under the Area C Development Programme (financed through the EU and the SDC), as well as the lessons learned from the mid-term evaluation of Area C conducted through the EU. It was stated by the evaluators: *"The Project has been carried out more or less as an engineering/construction project focusing and constructing a certain number of infrastructure sub-projects. Following such a top-down construction management approach has left little space for participatory processes to take place. The Project could have been more effective if the construction activities were augmented by other accompanying socially and/or environmentally related training/interventions. It is important, in this case to strike the right balance between administrative management requirements to carry out the construction component versus engaging in a development dialogue/support with the LGUs".*

The primary objective of this task is to complement the Programme's hard infrastructure Component by enhancing civic participation of vulnerable communities in local-decision making and thereby improving citizen-local governmental relations and the latter's accountability.

Addressing the needs of the marginalized communities by improving service delivery and their participation in decision making process cannot be fully realized without the effective involvement and assistance of civil society.

This task will be conducted through reputable and experienced (NGO) as an implementing partner to empower the local community activities and to provide the needed support and social management and assistance to enhance the capacity of the concerned LGUs and local communities in Area C for social and public sustainable services delivery in the target localities.





3. Objective of the Assignment:

The overall objective of this assignment is to mainstream citizen engagement and social accountability in local decisions making to improve the development results and contribute to building sustainable systems and strategies for citizen engagement with local governance sector.

The specific objectives of the entire consultancy is to institutionalize citizen engagement and social accountability in local governance through adopting formal guidelines/procedures and good practices for strengthening civic engagement as an approach where marginalized communities have the power to influence the decisions and services provided by the LGUs. In order to have progress toward effective community participation (CP), the consultancy will focus on the following:

- ✓ Integrate and institutionalize CP and SA tools and practices in LGUs affairs.
- ✓ Build the capacity of LGUs employees, and decision-makers to apply SA concepts and tools in the LGUs for accountable service delivery.
- ✓ Awareness/engagement of the citizens and the LGUs councils' members on the projects activities and the projects related data.
- Awareness to the citizens about the action plans and update the communities' priorities in a participatory manner as needed, and provide assistance to LGUs in addressing their needs to MoLG.
- ✓ Build the awareness of the concerned LGUs and citizens on the concept of operation and maintenance of the implemented sub-projects in coordination with the Local Technical Consultants (LTCs).
- ✓ Enhance the role of media in social accountability, and increase the public's access to information.
- ✓ Enhance complaints mechanisms within the framework of social accountability in the targeted locations and increase citizens role on how to use them.
- ✓ Increase community participation including women, youth and marginalized groups, ensuring that they are heard and their inputs are reflected in the joint decision – making.
- ✓ Implement a at least two social accountability tools among the targeted LGUs.
- ✓ Additionally, the NGO will be requested to assist in prioritizing and implementing a number of communities initiatives.

4. Tasks and Responsibilities

The consulting NGO will work closely with MDLF' staff, and while performing this assignment it must adhere to the principles and transversal themes to include gender & youth empowerment, do no harm, human rights-based approach, collective sensitive program management (CSPM), in alignment with SA tools and instrument endorsed by MOLG. In particular, the consulting NGO should fulfill the following tasks:

Prepare training materials, checklists, and guidebook to promote and facilitate community engagement. Design and implement training programs and coaching for LGUs officials, civic groups (CBOs), local social mobilizers (special attention should be given to youth, women and people with special needs) and citizens at the community level. Develop and provide 4 training days (20 training hours) on civic participation and social accountability for LGUs official and concerned staff including decision makers and councils' members. Develop and provide 5 training days (25 training hours) on civic participation and social accountability for civic groups, community mobilizers , vulnerable groups including youth and women. Conduct evaluation of the training program and highlight the lessons to improve the capacity of both local authorities' teams and community members and groups. Document the training program and develop a report that includes lessons learned and recommendations. |

Conduct quarterly "learning through reflection" meetings (3 hours each) in each targeted LGU. Conduct a progress survey by the end of the first year and by the end of the project in each targeted municipal area. - Implementation of effective programs: an organization that has programs and volunteers in the local community.
- Recent involvement in studies or evaluation of social accountability interventions.
